- Worship times and locations are listed in the Monthly Events Calendar. Please pay attention to the following changes to the typical schedule as we accommodate the Annual Vestry Meetings for Holy Trinity Lombardy and the Parish of Kitley by moving their worship those days to 11 AM:
  - March 3rd worship is at 9 AM in Athens and 11 AM in Lombardy for Lombardy AVM
  - March 10th worship is at 11 AM in Newbliss for Kitley AVM
- Holy Week will soon be upon us. We will have regional opportunities to gather for worship and fellowship: Maundy Thursday (Mar 28<sup>th</sup>) 6 PM at Holy Trinity Oak Leaf with potluck Agape meal and Eucharist; Great Vigil (Sat. Mar 30<sup>th</sup>) at 8 PM at Holy Trinity Lombardy. We will also have ecumenical Walk of the Cross events on Good Friday (Mar 29<sup>th</sup>) at 10 AM in Seeleys Bay and Athens with services following at 11 AM. There are also Good Friday services at St. Andrew's UC, Toledo at 2 PM and Holy Trinity Lombardy at 4 PM.
- Easter Sunrise services will take place at the Athens Cemetery (behind Athens UC) and the Toledo Cross Mar 31<sup>st</sup> at 7 AM. Easter services will take place at Lombardy and Newbliss at 9 AM, Athens at 11 AM, at St. Luke's Leeds at 11:30 AM at Olivet.
- We continue to offer worship online with weekly Sunday Morning Prayer at 9AM and Wednesday Evening Prayer at 7PM. They are always available following the service on both our YouTube channel and Facebook page so you can still worship with us any time.

### **Discipleship**

- St. Luke's Leeds is hosting a Lenten Quiet Day on Saturday March 16<sup>th</sup> from 10 AM 2 PM at Seeleys Bay United Church, 29 Hellen St). The Quiet Day includes worship, lunch, and opportunities for silent reflection on the themes of Lent
