<u>The Story - The Divine Dove</u> (based on Matthew 3:16, Mark 1:10, Luke 3:22 & John 1:32)

> Superpower: Part of the Holy Trinity, shares gifts and power with us at baptism.

As Christians we believe in God the Holy Trinity (Three Persons). Often when we pray we call this Trinity, 'God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit'.




The Bible tells us about the Holy Spirit in many places - at the beginning of creation, giving life to humans, guiding the prophets, helping us to know the truth, and giving us gifts to help us live good lives.


The Bible also describes the Holy Spirit in many ways - like 'wind' and like 'breath', like 'fire' at Pentecost, and the Holy Spirit is also described as a dove.



When Jesus was ready to start his ministry of teaching, preaching and healing, he went to the Jordan River to be baptised by his cousin John.



After Jesus was baptized in the river, he saw the heavens open up and the Holy Spirit coming down on him like a Dove.





Jesus promised that the Holy Spirit would be with his people after he returned to heaven.

We remember that promise every time someone is baptized, and we thank God for all the gifts the Holy Spirit gives to us.



St. Paul tells us that the fruit of the Holy Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

How blessed we are that the Holy Spirit, the dove, shares God's gifts and power with us!

Which description of the Holy Spirit do you like best? Why?


What gifts or fruits of the Holy Spirit do you think you already show in your life? How?


What gifts or fruits of the Holy Spirit do you want to pray to have more of?


